Year 7

1. Use UNICEF's website to research the UN Convention on the rights of the child.
 - 1) Find out what the convention is, why it was created and what it says.
 - 2) Draw pictures that represents each right that is contained within the convention.
 - 3) Use UNICEF's website or other sources like the BBC to find two news stories where children have been denied their rights. Create a fact file about each of the news stories.

2. Use the video from the University of Derby to draw a picture/diagram of a Magistrates Court.
