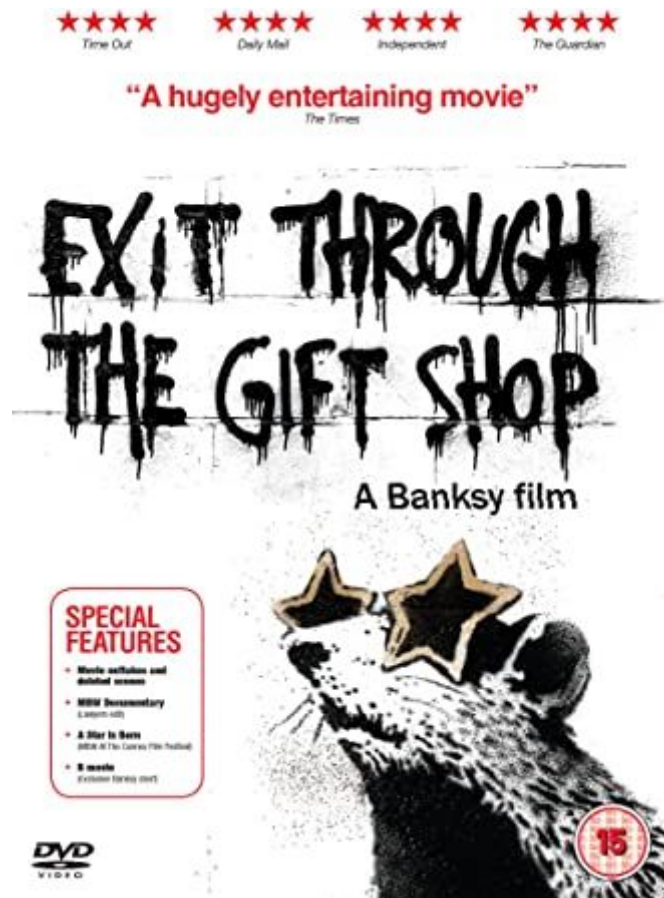

Learning Objective

To create a Banksy style bank note.



In 2004 Banksy produced 1 million pounds worth of ten pound notes with the image of Princess Dianna on the front instead of the Queen. The notes were also altered to say 'Banksy of England' instead of Bank of England. Banksy had planned to throw notes off of a building, but changed his mind after some notes which were given out at a festival were actually used to buy things.

- What pictures would you use?
- Would you include a picture of someone famous or someone you know?

Design your bank note in your sketchbook or on A4 paper

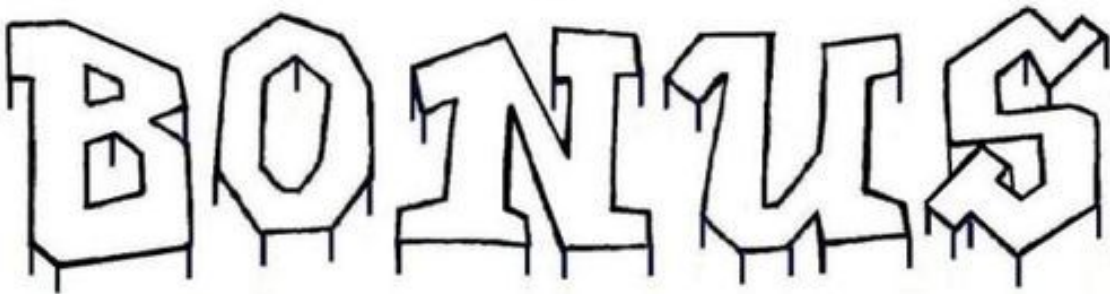
Learning Objective

To create 3D Graffiti Block Letters

Step 1. First draw a word with block letters.
You can add serifs (feet) and corners to make it more interesting.



Step 2. Now from the bottom of each letter, and every corner on the outside of the letters, draw a straight line directly downwards. Each line should be the same length.



Step 3. Now you are going to connect the lines to form the 3-D. Draw a straight line from the tip of each downward line to the line directly next to it. Follow the shape of the letter.



Step 4. Color in the 3-D.

How to make your name

Grffiti Style

You will need: paper, a pencil, eraser and a marker to outline your finished name.

1. Come up with a name or tag. *Keep colorful, keep cool!*
2. Practice drawing your tag in bubble letters or block letters.

3. Draw guidelines to show an interesting shape for your final tag.



4. Draw your name inside the shape or lines. Make sure the block or bubble letters are sandwiched real close together.

Keep your letters pretty vertical!



Think about how the negative space creates interest!



By starting in the middle of your name!

5. Extend letters past the shape or add scripts to create emphasis.



6. Erase lines that join or overlap.



7. Add a shadow to your letters or a facial outline, or both!



8. Great job! Now you have made some street art!

9. What can you add to your tag to make it unique?



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Gerald Scarfe

Political Caricatures

Gerald Scarfe is an English cartoonist and illustrator. He has worked as cartoonist for *The Sunday Times* and illustrator for *The New Yorker*.

His other work includes graphics for rock group Pink Floyd, particularly on their 1979 album *The Wall*, its 1982 film adaptation, and tour (1980–81), as well as the music video for "Welcome to the Machine" Scarfe was the production designer on the Disney animated feature *Hercules* (1997).

Gerald Scarfe has created many caricatures of well known politicians. Research Gerald Scarfe political caricatures and copy one of your choice.

Then write about the following:

What is his style like?

How does he exaggerate the features?

What statement is he making about that politician?

What do you like or not like about his style of drawing?
