Toughest	Describe and evaluate a theory you have studied. Remember to use key terms and structure your answer.	Create a movie explaining anything you have learnt from this topic. Create a short film to act as a revision guide for yourself and the class.	Create a story book on a topic we have covered. Be creative, make it attractive and remember who you are aiming it at!	Design your own experiment. It must include an aim, hypothesis, and procedure. Explain how you analyse the results.	Design your own lesson on a topic you have studied recently. It needs to be engaging, and have a clear starter, main activity, assessment & end.	USE YOUR IMAGINATION! Prove to me you have understood the topic studied. This is a difficult option as I am not going to be easily convinced!
Tougher	Create a fact sheet summarising a lesson, add in additional facts. Use key words correctly, use the internet to add in extra information	Create an exemplar answer to a 6 mark question. Look at a past paper, use the mark scheme to write your answer.	Create a poster on a famous psychologist. Include a timeline of their achievements and state what they are famous for.	Write a newspaper article on a theory or experiment. Lay it out like a newspaper. Add quotes and pictures.	Create a comic strip on an experiment you have studied. Make it interesting and funny. It must be factual though.	Create a revision sheet on a topic you have studied. Is it detailed and written in your own words? Can it help others?
Tough	Create a glossary of key terms we have studied. Write the definition and an example for each.	Write 3 Tweets that could summarise the lesson/topic. No more than 280 (try for 140) characters. Use #'s for key words.	Write a list of 10 challenging quiz questions about a topic you have studied. Make sure you write the answers down. Bonus marks if you can stump Mrs Brind.	Complete two 3 mark past exam questions. Use one from the textbook or ask a teacher to give you the questions.	Create a starter activity for a lesson. It could be a recap task, a game, or a warm up task. It must be relevant.	Create a crossword puzzle. Use key terms which you could give to other students to use as revision.
