Dear Parent/Carer

In the meantime, here are some updates:

### **FAB!**

Our Friends and Associates of Budmouth group held an online virtual meeting last week. We do look forward to the time when we can hold such meetings face to face but, in the meantime, it was lovely to be able to catch up and answer general questions and to share our experience of what it has been like to manage a school with such unusual restrictions. As always, the notes from our meeting will be placed on the website. There was specific interest in whether some of the changes we have had to make due to Covid-19 restrictions may in fact be worth keeping permanently. The split lunchtimes and virtual Parents' Evenings were raised as examples of these. We do intend to review our amended practices and we will consult on a number of these later in the academic year.

I am very pleased to inform you about a new appointment that we have made to the Aspirations South West Region. Andy David will be joining us in September 2021. ### **Student Safety**

We have seen an increasing number of students riding to school on bikes and scooters who are not wearing a safety helmet. It is obviously very important for their own safety that they wear an appropriate helmet. We will not allow them to bring their bike or scooter to school if they do not comply and, as a place of education, it would be wrong for us to turn a blind eye to this dangerous practice. 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### **Face Coverings**

It remains the case that students must wear a face covering in indoor areas where there is mass movement. On the whole our students have been very good at remembering them, but in recent days we have been having to issue more daily disposable use coverings and these are not cheap, so please ensure that your child has a face covering each day they are in school. Any exempt students have been issued a wristband that they must wear to easily identify themselves to staff.

As mentioned in my 4<sup>th</sup> December letter, just a reminder that during the first week of the holidays, school staff will be required to support 'track-and-trace' in any cases where students may have come into contact with someone who had a positive test at the end of term.
