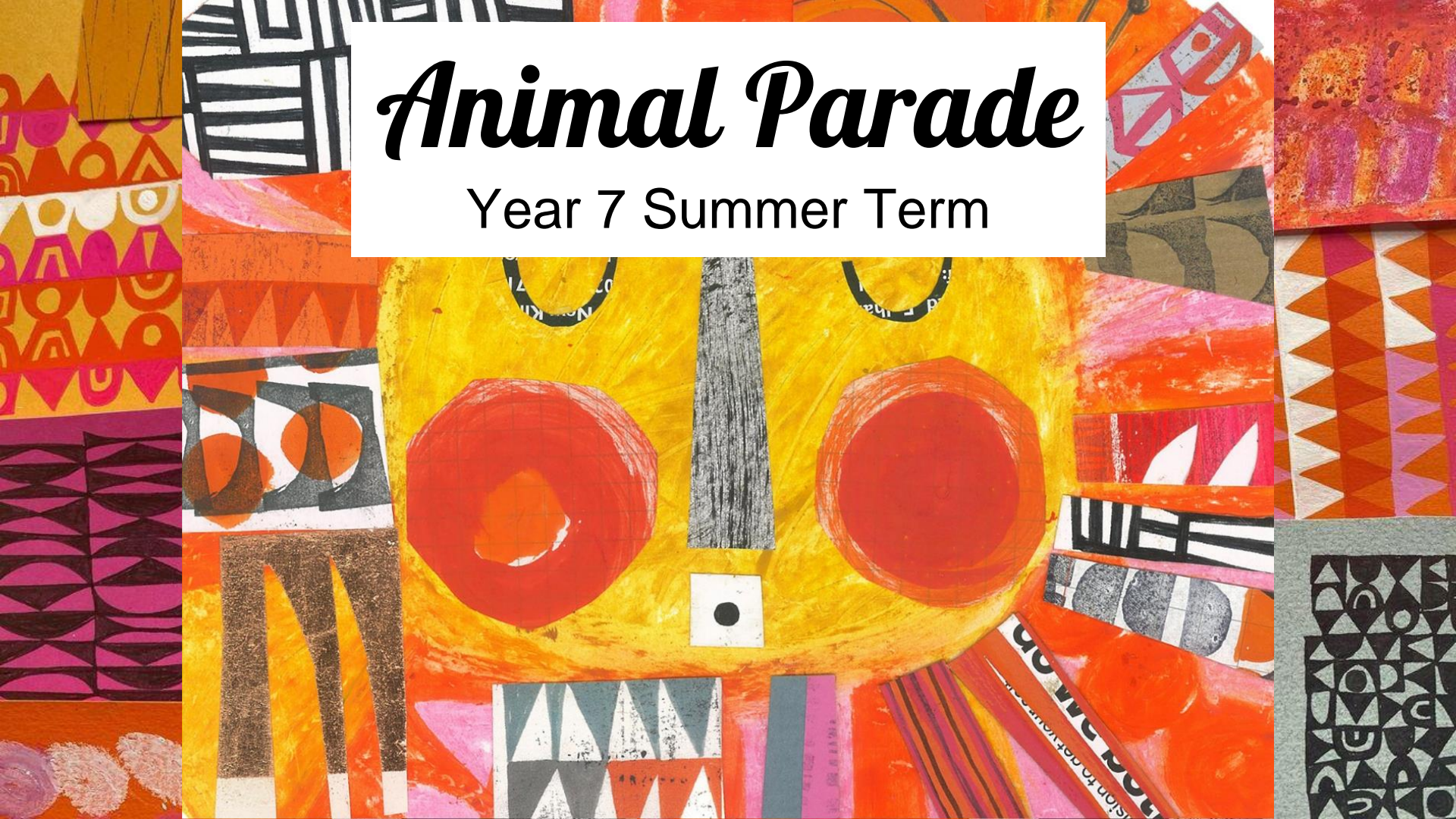

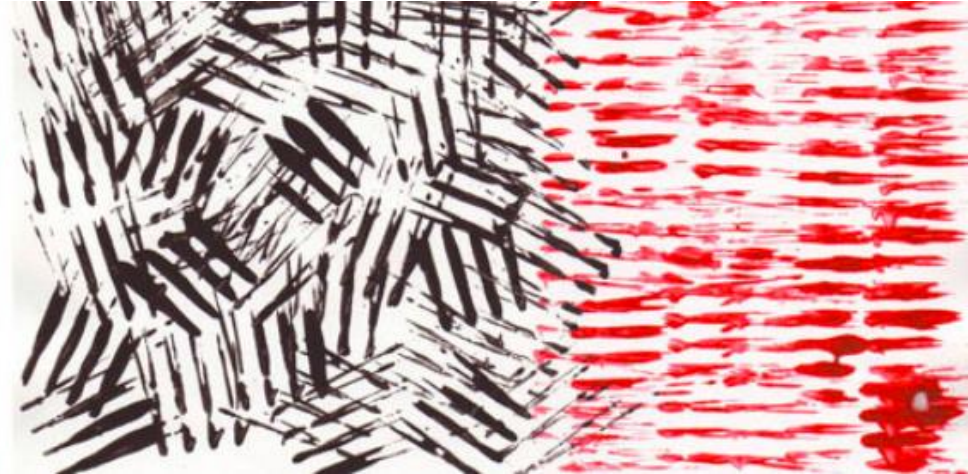

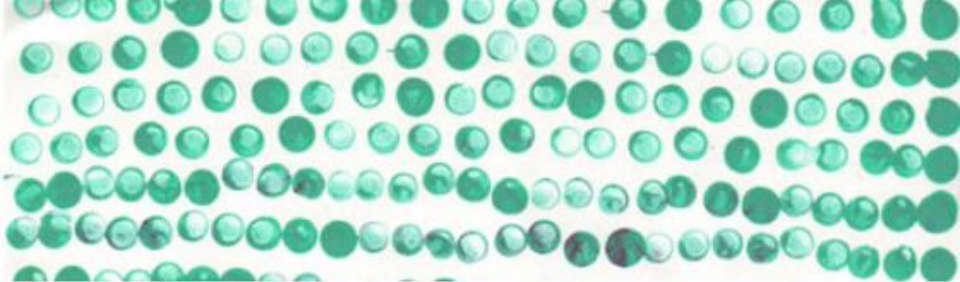


# Art doesn't have to be a precious exercise

Art can be realistic (that's fine) but it can also be playful, messy, scribbly, enthusiastic, accidental, abstract, disruptive...



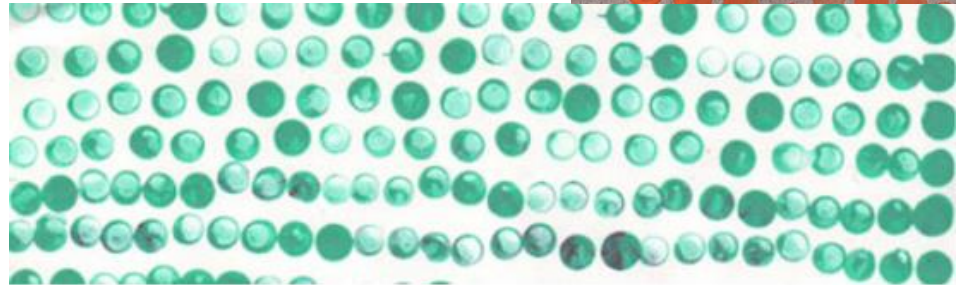
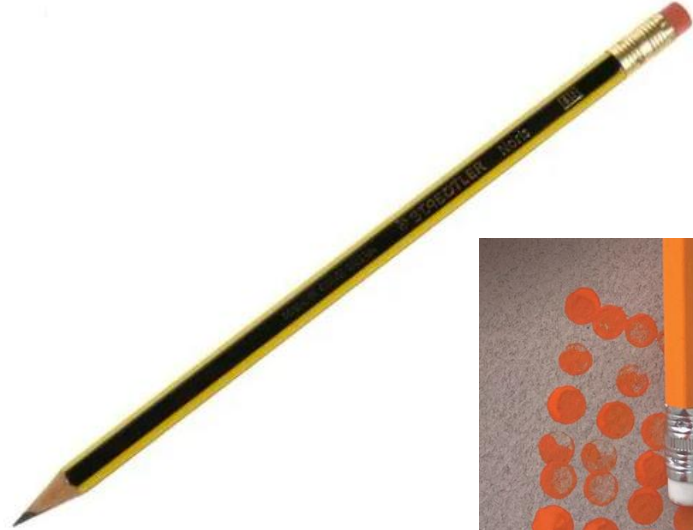
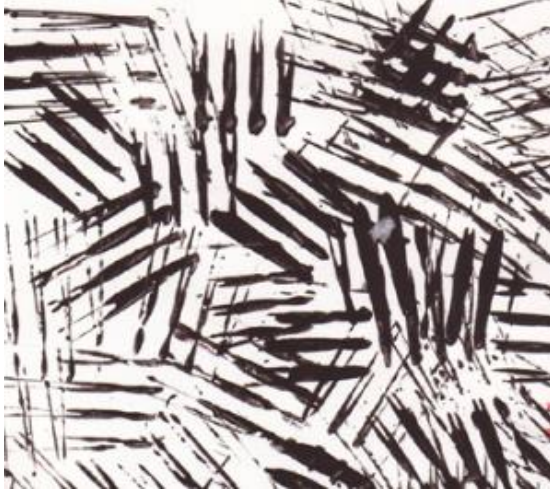

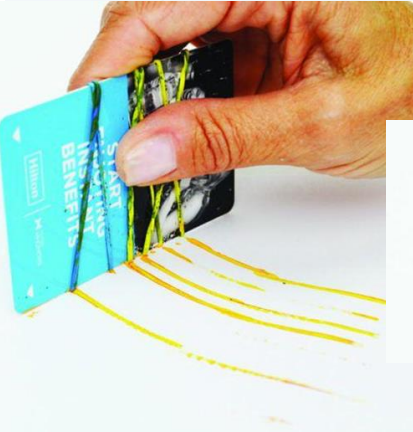
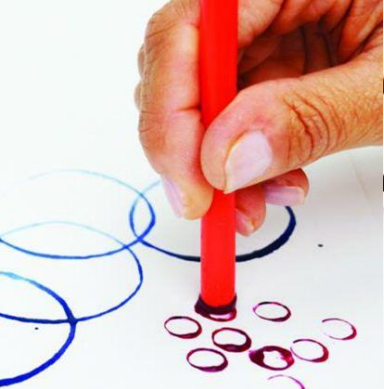


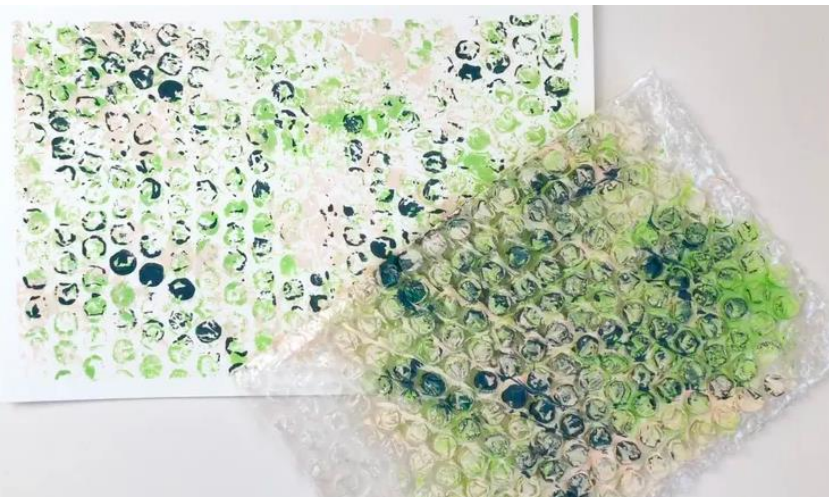
You will be using poster paint for this task. It is more watery than acrylic paint - so you will need to take the excess off your object before printing
