
lettigonioidea MECHANICAL **INSECTS**







Learning Objective To create drawings inspired by the mechanic animals of Vladimir Gvozdev

Learning Objective

Create a mechanical insect or animal drawing inspired by Vladimir Gvezdev and Steampunk

Success Criteria

You have drawn the shape of the insect

You have added mechanical objects such as nuts, bolts, cogs, pipes and screws to the the insect.


You have coloured the insect and used tone to show texture.



How shall I draw it?

You will draw your mechanical insects in 3 steps.

- I. You can begin a light outline of insect in pencil.
- 2. Add COGS and MECHANICAL OBJECTS.
- 3. Work up your drawing in pen, or dip pen and ink using line, hatching and cross-hatching.











Can I add colour?

Yes! I have blended some different coloured pencils into my drawing. Be careful not to press too hard or you will cover your lines up.

I then scrunched up my page and scuffed some of the creases to make it look like an old piece of paper.

What if I have finished?

Think about creating a whole page of these mechanical insects, changing the size and position on the page.
