Similarly, Mr Bullock and his team have been impressed by the huge uptake in extracurricular sport, and the success we have seen in Netball, Cross Country, Rugby and Football, for example, has reflected this amazing level of participation. Mr Bullock has been particularly pleased with girls' participation in sport, which is increasing all the time. It is great to see our fitness suite being used before, during and after school by so many students. Congratulations goes to the year 7 football team and to their coach, Mr De La Haye. They

have worked very hard at improving their game and are now through to the quarterfinals of the National Cup. They play Great Marlow school away on the 23rd of February. To get this far in a national competition is incredible in itself, and we wish the boys luck in their next match.

Half term breaks always represent a good opportunity for us to reflect upon the uniform and conduct of students in school. The number of students who have picked up rewards, awards and achievement points is bigger than ever, with over **233,000 points** awarded across the school since September. This demonstrates how hard working and engaged the vast majority of our students are. Unfortunately though, we have had to charge and issue suspensions to some students who have deliberately vandalised toilets in school. We have recently spent time adding hooks to toilet doors, repairing the infrastructure and employing more cleaning time to help students who need access to toilets during lessons. Despite this, there are still some students who would deny this right for others, and we will not tolerate this.

I am always struck by how smart our students look in school, but I would like to remind parents and students that skin-tight trousers or leggings, trainers and branded socks should never be worn. We are always happy to support students who may face genuine uniform/financial issues. Please contact your child's head of school if you have any concerns regarding uniform, and we will do everything we can to assist you.

Last week we took a group of year 11, 12 and 13 students to **Marjon University in Plymouth**. Our students were directly involved in training sessions for student teachers, giving them their view on what makes a good teacher and tips on how best to manage their classes. It was great to see our current generation of students helping the teachers of the future, as they embark upon their own fledgling careers.
